- LPBA Meeting May 18<sup>th</sup>, another good turn out with nearly 20 in attendance. Raffle for a Fishing Charter for 4 or Moonlight Cruise for 4. Can purchase tickets from any LPBA member at \$1 piece or 6 for \$5. All proceeds will be going to build a new welcome sign. Members would like to build a sign with a model of the Harbor Light included.
- Shoreline Committee Meeting May 19<sup>th</sup>. Members will be submitting a report, similar to the white paper given to Congressman Dingell, to the Army Corps of Engineers to see what is within their scope of possibilities. Then there will be a meeting between Dingell, the ACOE, Mr. Stewart and myself. The test groins in Allen's Cove produced what appears to be an increase of approx 18 inches of sand nourishment against the dike wall. They need rip wrap support on the sides, because they have moved due to wave action. Also what to do with the sills and cutting the vegetation along the shoreline. It was a unanimous decision to include replacement of the floodgates in Venice Canals on the top of priority list to ACOE.
