Mayors Report July 10, 2008

Council and Residents Concerns

- Marketing the upcoming mileage, this can not be done by any City official or with money from the City. A committee would need to be formed by business owners or residences in order to place signs or organize a meet the candidate event.

- Our Police Chief will not park an empty cruiser on the street for speed & noise control purposes, due to possible damage of important and vital equipment. Our new officer is nearly ready to be on his own and at that time the schedule will be such that there will be no gap in the hours that many of the speeding incidences have occurred. This issue will soon be resolved.
- I communicated Councils decision concerning Muddy Creek to concerned residents in Allens Cove. I told them that when a jetty is in place to slow sand migration the City will be more inclined to maintain the creek for boaters.
- I sent an e-mail to Mr. Gayar, of Sunoco, about the lights in the back parking lot. Requesting that the lights be moved further back or a parking barrier be placed forward to prevent trucks from backing into the lights and knocking them over.

Meetings & Business

- June 30, 2008 attended Monroe County Draft Coastal Zone Plan and Draft of Master Plan of Future Use Map. Noted that when we signed the contract to add North Shores to our WWTP we agreed to not support any development on undeveloped property North of Allens Cove. Also I found it interesting that the County has determined the land West of I-75 in Erie is to be used for light industry/science/technology. The County has voiced their concern that this will be difficult if there are no utilities on that side of the expressway.
- Preparations for Kids Day continue, Brad Laking is paying to have a live band perform for the teen dance in the evening. Dirk and the Diggers!
- Preparations for the garage sale on July 5th for City Hall.
- Organization of old documents is critical to the infrastructure of our government. As well as the preservation of our history.
